A three-day Teacher Training Program (20/05/26 – 22/05/26) was conducted before the commencement of the new academic year to equip teachers with innovative teaching strategies and professional skills.

An **ERP Training Program** was conducted on 20th May, 2026 for the teaching staff. The session focused on familiarizing teachers with the school's Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system. Teachers were guided on: **Attendance Management, Academic Record Maintenance, Student Information Management, Effective Use of Digital Resources.** The training enhanced the staff's understanding of technology integration in school administration and ensured smooth implementation of ERP-related activities throughout the academic year.



The second day session was conducted by **Mr. Sumit**. The training focused on modern pedagogical approaches and engaging classroom practices. The key topics covered were: **Mind Mapping Techniques, Pre-learning Strategies, Design Thinking.** The resource person emphasized the importance of creative and student-centered learning. Various interactive activities and games such as **Seven Up** and **Tower Game** were conducted to enhance teamwork, communication, and problem-solving skills among teachers. The session was highly engaging and provided practical ideas for classroom implementation.



The third day of the training programme focused on professional development, effective time management, and creating a safe and supportive educational environment.



The first session was conducted by **Dr. Sahana**. She conducted an insightful session on **Growth Mindset and ROTI (Return on Time Invested)**. The session highlighted the significance of utilizing time effectively and maintaining a positive mindset for professional growth and productivity. The second session was conducted by **Mrs. Shobha Bhadhirish**. She conducted an informative and awareness-oriented session on **POCSO**

(Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act) and POSH (Prevention of Sexual Harassment at Workplace). The session created awareness regarding child protection, workplace ethics, legal responsibilities, and the role of teachers in ensuring a safe and secure environment for students and staff.
